In a continued effort to keep everyone safe and healthy, the showcase will be live streamed on YouTube. The streaming date/time will be determined at a later date. As always our programs are designed to give all students, novices and seasoned performers alike, the opportunity to participate in the theater experience. The objective of each class is to give the student a creative, collaborative atmosphere that fosters their self-esteem and communication skills. Descriptions of Classes:

MT Production, Grades 1-4:

5:00-6:30 pm Mondays AND Thursdays

Show: *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown* - CLASS IS FULL. WAITLIST AVAILABLE!

A concert version of a well known classic! Students in this class will learn theater vocabulary, work on acting skills, and develop proper singing technique while working towards a staged concert version of *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*. An audition workshop will be held during the first two classes to assign roles and lines. Materials will be supplied. Teachers will assign roles based on students' ability to take direction, work with other students, and speak in a loud, clear voice.

Theatre Production, Grades 9-12:

12:00-3:00 Saturdays

Show: *12 Angry Jurors* - Registration for this class is closed.

A staged reading of a well known classic! Students will participate in an audition workshop which will be held during the first two classes to assign roles. Materials will be supplied. Students will work together to create a socially distant staged reading, by engaging in scene work, monologue work, and company work.

MT Production, Grades 9-12:

3:30-5:00 Tuesdays AND Fridays

Show: *Heathers* - ADDED BY POPULAR DEMAND

A concert version of the cult classic movie, turned stage musical! Students in this class will learn theater vocabulary, work on acting skills, and develop proper singing technique while working towards a final concert presentation of *Heathers*. An audition workshop will be held during the first two classes to assign roles and lines. Materials will be supplied. Teachers will assign roles based on students' ability to take direction, work with other students, and speak in a loud, clear voice.*

Vocal Ensemble, Grades 5-8:

6:30-7:30 Tuesdays AND Fridays

If your child loves the vocal opportunities in our voice class and also the excitement of shows like *Glee*, this Vocal Ensemble will keep them singing! Intended as a stepping stone between Voice and Glee, this engaging class will concentrate on healthy vocal technique in an active ensemble-based setting. Students will sing selections from both musical theatre and popular music with an emphasis on group work and harmonization.*

Advanced Character Study, Grades 9-12:

5:00-6:30 Tuesdays AND Fridays

Our advanced character study class will guide students through the process of creating a complete on-stage character. This class is designed for both singers and non-singers who are interested in investigating character arcs. With both teacher and student input, each actor will be assigned either a role from a musical and a straight play and will explore all facets of their chosen character. The first two classes will be utilized to assess students' interests and abilities. In the subsequent classes, students will work both alone and together to create monologues, scenes, and songs from pivotal points in their assigned shows in order to delve as deeply as possible into the material. Both acting and vocal coaching will be explored in this class in a workshop-like setting.*

Voice Class, Grades 1-4:

4:30-5:30 Fridays

Voice class will give students who love to sing the opportunity to explore both solo and group vocals in musical theatre! With an emphasis on singing technique, this class will also focus on audition protocol and preparation. Students will learn a variety of songs and skills to prepare them for both audition and performance settings in the future.*

Cost: \$175 Member Cost: \$150

Glee, Grades 8-12:

6:30-7:30 Mondays AND Thursdays

Back by popular demand, this advanced voice class focuses on honing musical skills for our older students. Harmonization, solo work, vocal technique, working as an ensemble, and ear training skills will all be honed in this class through advanced musical selections. In the style of *Pitch Perfect* and *Glee*, various genres including musical theatre, popular songs, and film music will be explored. Some stylized movement will be included.*

Cost: \$300 Member Cost: \$270

MT Dance

5-6:30 Mondays AND Thursdays Grades 5-8

This class aims to build upon the basics of dance by incorporating more advanced steps and techniques. Dancers will learn routines set to Broadway music while developing the ability to perform fundamental dance steps, listen and follow directions, and retain choreography. Students will increase their flexibility and endurance, learn standard musical theater dance vocabulary, and most importantly – have fun!

Intro to Tap

5:00-6:30 Tuesdays AND Fridays

An ideal class for beginners with little to no experience, this class is for the student who wishes to improve rhythm and musicality while learning and developing basic tap technique. Students will learn basic tap vocabulary and will refine the skills developed over the course of the class. Students will perform a series of tap numbers in a virtual showcase at the end of the session. **All students must provide their own tap shoes.**

Cost: \$450 Member Cost: \$400
